CONTROLLER'S OFFICE SUBMITS UPDATE TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON NEW DATABASE THAT PROVIDES COMPREHENSIVE INFORMATION ON CRIMINALS

RALEIGH – The Office of the State Controller has submitted the CJLEADS (Criminal Justice Law Enforcement Automated Data Services) update report to the General Assembly. Quality assurance and user testing began in May on the pilot project, designed to provide an efficient, “one-stop” tool for criminal justice professionals to view North Carolina offender information. Later this year, after quality assurance and user testing confirms the project’s business and data requirements, the pilot application will be provided to select Wake County users for user testing in normal business situations.

The initial release of the pilot application provides:

- A secure portal with a single log on to provide criminal justice professionals with integrated offender information needed for decision making.
- The integration of court case, warrant, orders for arrest, incarceration and community corrections data.
- The ability to search for an offender using characteristics such as name, address, date of birth, identification numbers (SSN, FBI #, State ID, Driver’s License #) and/or court case information.
- The initial deployment of over 12 detail and summary screens to display integrated offender information including offender summary, timeline, criminal history, incarceration, community corrections, gang affiliation and personal attributes such as scars, marks and tattoos. Sample user interface screens are included in Appendix F of the report.
- The ability for a user to build an offender watch list of persons of interest and to receive alerts when those offenders have a change in status, such as an arrest, pending court date, or release from custody.
- The application of role-based security which controls the display of information based on the role of the criminal justice professional.
